We are entering our sixth year since the Fitzroy Partnership was established in 2012. Our focus is to be recognised as a trustworthy and reliable provider of waterway health assessments for the Fitzroy Basin. Early June 2018 will see the release of our seventh annual ecosystem health report card.

In terms of reputational standing, the Fitzroy Partnership for River Health is recognised as an international template for success in how community, government and industry can work together to manage shared water risks. The International Council on Mining and Metals, an initiative of the World Bank Group, recently identified the Fitzroy Partnership for River Health as an internationally significant example of shared water stewardship in the mining sector.


Access individualised site reports. Detailed site reports are available that allow members to explore supplied data for monitoring sites and compare this to ecosystem health thresholds.




Stunning environmental reports


