This year we released our 11th ecosystem health report card and are encouraged the trend over the last 11 years shows the Fitzroy Basin is resilient. Following our ten year milestone last year, our Science team have turned their attention to our 10-year data review to enhance our program design, and our communications and engagement team planned and staged a 10-year celebration event incorporating a Water Management Round Table and Gala Dinner.



We are now the third longest running Report Card group in the world, and it is imperative that for Fitzroy Partnership to remain relevant into the future we must not only continue to assess and report on local waterways for the community but widen our scope to provide a platform for collaboration for partners towards better water management in the Fitzroy Basin.

We were privileged to have the involvement of First Nations representatives at our Water Management Round Table focused on 'Incorporating cultural values in water management' and were proud to support involvement in FBA's CQ Big Data Forum. While we acknowledge we have a long way to go, we hope these small steps will allow us to continue the conversation and work towards better understanding of cultural values and incorporating these into our report card.
