Join the lines to match up the ways our partners and community members are helping protect and improve the condition of our creeks and rivers. We've done the first one for you!



- Mining companies upgrade their water management to implement Reverse Osmosis plants, remove contaminants from on-site water and re-use onsite water to reduce water usage.



- Cotton farmers change their fertilizer program to reduce the amount of nitrogen on their crops, to reduce chemicals that enter local waterways.



- Graziers fence off their waterways and put in water troughs for their cattle to stop erosion of their local creeks and rivers.



- The local council upgrades their Sewerage Treatment Plant in a regional town improving the quality of effluent/discharge into local waterways.



- An increasing number of people are joining clean-up and other community events to pick up litter, plant trees and do their bit for the environment!



- My family uses our local Containers for Change depot to recycle our bottles and cans...and save some money while we're at it!



- Government introduces a ban on single-use plastic straws, plates, food containers to reduce landfill, stop plastic pollution and litter entering our waterways.



- Planting trees and shrubs on hill slopes helps stop erosion and runoff of sediment into local waterways.
