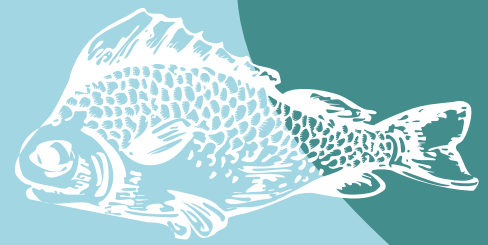

ABOUT FITZROY partnership



Fitzroy Partnership for River Health (FPRH) brings together a unique collective of government, industry, research and community stakeholders who share a common goal: ensuring the long-term health of waterways across the Fitzroy Basin – the largest river basin draining to the world heritage listed Great Barrier Reef.

Established in 2012, FPRH plays a central role in improving water quality monitoring, bringing together data from across the region to develop independent, science-based report cards on waterway health. These annual reports, reviewed by our Independent Science Panel, provide detailed, unbiased, and accessible information to the community about the condition and trends of our waterways. In 2026, we marked a major milestone with the release of our 15th Report Card – delivering a decade of consistent data and cementing our reputation as Queensland’s leading regional report card collective.

Our Partnership Network includes a diverse mix of long-standing members from all levels of government, industry sectors, consulting, higher education, and regional communities, many of whom have been with us since inception. Together, we provide a powerful platform for collaboration, knowledge sharing, and innovation in waterway management.

Beyond reporting, FPRH actively engages the community through initiatives like Fitzroy Water Watch, promoting citizen science and raising awareness of the vital connection between healthy river systems and a thriving regional economy.

With a vision of “a healthy, resilient Fitzroy Basin sustained by trusted, independent science and shared stewardship,” FPRH is committed to driving informed action and fostering partnerships that support both environmental sustainability and regional development.

Reporting and Data

Our flagship annual Fitzroy Basin Report Card is overseen by an Independent Science Panel who play a crucial role ensuring FPRH's reporting is grounded in credible, up-to-date science. This report is one of a suite produced by FPRH to help track changes in local waterway health over time and impacts that may flow into the Great Barrier Reef. Released in the second half of the year, the Report Card is a powerful tool for understanding and communicating your organisation's impact on our local waterways, and the underlying data is freely available to Partners for developing tailored reports. The Report Card is shared on our website and social media, and the release includes a dedicated session exploring the key findings and trends.

Promoting Stewardship

Showcase your organisation's sustainability initiatives through our flagship annual publication and awards program. Distributed to a network of over 800 key stakeholders and community groups, the stewardship report is also promoted through our social media channels and events—offering wide exposure for your stewardship work. An Awards program celebrates the best in stewardship based on case studies and stewardship stories submitted by our Partners.

Community Engagement

We actively promote our Partners and waterway health through community events, school programs, workshops, and citizen science activities. These engagements help build trust and awareness, while reinforcing your organisation's role in environmental leadership. School activities provide opportunities for Partner organisations to engage with their local communities including hosting experiments and producing mini Report Cards for schools.

BECOMING A partner

Joining Fitzroy Partnership for River Health is a strategic investment in environmental sustainability, community trust, and regional impact.

Our entry level Partner membership starts at \$6,600 inc. GST per annum, with an additional \$9,625 inc. GST per site or operation, bringing the typical annual contribution to \$16,225 inc. GST for most organisations. Major Partner membership can be negotiated and starts at \$30,250 inc. GST. Many of our long-standing Partners recognise the long-term value of their involvement and choose to enter into multi-year agreements with increased investment and deeper engagement.

We're happy to discuss tailored membership options that align with your organisation's goals, operational footprint and commitment to waterway health in the Fitzroy Basin.

Applications to join FPRH require your organisation to undertake a self-assessment against our selection criteria. This is then reviewed by the Management Committee and once approved you will sign a Memorandum of Understanding.
